THE BILL concerns land use approvals for private nonprofit institutions of higher education and supplementing P.L.1975, c.291.

**IF ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

A private institution of higher education organized as a nonprofit corporation under N.J.S.15A:1-1 et seq. or acting under the authority of N.J.S.18A:68-6, and licensed by the State to confer degrees pursuant to N.J.S.18A:68-1 et seq., and which is eligible to receive funds under P.L.1979, c.132 (C.18A:72B-15 et seq.), shall be exempt from the provisions of P.L.1975, c.291 (C.40:55D-1 et seq.), to the same extent as a college organized State under N.J.S.18A:64-1. Under current law, public colleges and university are exempt from local zoning jurisdictions in recognition of the critical public mission served by those institutions in educating the citizens of the state.
